How were we faithful in in ministry? How were we faithful in participating in God's simple **Philippians 2** Do nothing from selfish ambition or empty conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he existed in the form of God... emptied himself ...he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death— even death on a cross.

mission to love our neighbor? Now is the time to celebrate how God's Spirit has inspired your ministry! Give thanks to God and celebrate for the good that your congregation has accomplished!

Now is also the time to tell the truth about your ministry. How has your congregation fallen short and not been faithful to God's will? Lacked energy, a sense of purpose or mission? Now is the time to humbly tell the truth if your congregation has lost its focus or has little energy for God's work.

We all need to take an honest look in the rear view mirror of the last year and ask how have we been faithful and how have we failed to be faithful to our baptismal promises. Then we can boldly move into the New Year 2024 asking how we can with God's help do better.

The Church of England took a long look into the rear view mirror and with much prayer has discerned that moving forward they will strive to be a Simpler, Humbler and Bolder Church in the future. The Church of England described their vision for the future in this way:

Simpler, humbler, bolder are virtues we believe God is calling from us at this point in our history. They run through the vision and shape all we do and all that we are.

- Simpler because we are not as big a church as we used to be
- Humbler because we are facing our failures, and this is not easy.
- **Bolder** because the love of Christ compels us. We have a gospel to proclaim, and we live and minister in a world of much pain and confusion.

I believe these three virtues could also help us in the coming year. I invite your councils and leaders to lean into these questions in 2024:

- 1. Simpler: How can we simplify our structure so more time and energy can be spent on loving our neighbors and joining in God's mission in our community? How can we focus on what is really important and let go of the trivial or unnecessary?
- 2. Humbler: What isn't working? How have we fallen short? We can't do everything we use to do so what ONE thing can we do for Jesus? How can we work with other churches, denominations in our community?
- **3. Bolder**: How can your congregation be braver and bolder in sharing the good news about Jesus in a hurting world? In prophetic witness to

# **Associate Pastor's Report**

At the beginning of almost all of his epistles, the Apostle Paul comments on his thankfulness for the letter's recipients. Typical is Philippians 1:3: "I thank my God for every remembrance of you, always in every one of my prayers for all of you, praying with joy for your partnership in the gospel." I can't improve on that, so let that be my greeting as well.

In September I began my third year among you, and I'm thankful for every one of you for sharing in the ministry and mission of OELC. 2023 was another year of important moments in the congregation and in the community, not all of them happy ones. We said goodbye to cherished friends and family members who died and welcomed new sisters and brothers into God's family at the baptismal font. A huge class of graduates saw high school come to an end, and new challenges and opportunities open before them. Ten eighth graders affirmed their faith in May, and a new class of seventh graders entered the Confirmation program in September.

A group of four youth and two adults traveled to Kentucky in June for the 2023 Appalachia Service Project mission trip. The summer also featured OELC family night at an Osseo Merchants baseball game, and the first of what is hoped will be an annual Summer Fest in Central Park, featuring the music of Indianapolis artists Winona Avenue.

We again made an impact in the community. Osseo Veteran's Memorial Park was unveiled, including a paver sponsored by OELC. The Osseo Lions used our building for a snowed-out Easter egg hunt, the annual community Thanksgiving Day meal, and Breakfast with Santa. ARDC of Trempealeau County continued to coordinate Meals on Wheels deliveries from the church. The Tri-County Food Pantry and Osseo-Fairchild School District's Thunder Closet donations of money, clothes, food, and volunteer hours from OELC folks. OFSD Nurse Ashley Hurlburt commented to me, "You don't just talk about it, you do it." Many of you attended one of the bed builds hosted by Sleep in Heavenly Peace or donated resources. There's much more, but the point is that you, the people of OELC, are The Church, living out the gospel message in many ways each day.

My main focus remains the youth of OELC and the community. Both middle school (TGIF) and senior high youth gathered for events throughout the year. I have set up "classes" on an app called "Remind" as a way to communicate with youth and parents. I still try to attend as many games, concerts, and other events as possible to meet kids where they are rather than always expecting them to come to church, and I make myself available to the schools, especially if special circumstances arise, as happened this fall.

Again, thank you for your partnership and I pray 2024 brings blessings to you and your loved ones!

<u>2023 Pastoral acts through November</u>: Four funerals and two baptisms, Lila Johnson & Magnus Moen, at OELC, plus two graveside services and one baptism at other sites.

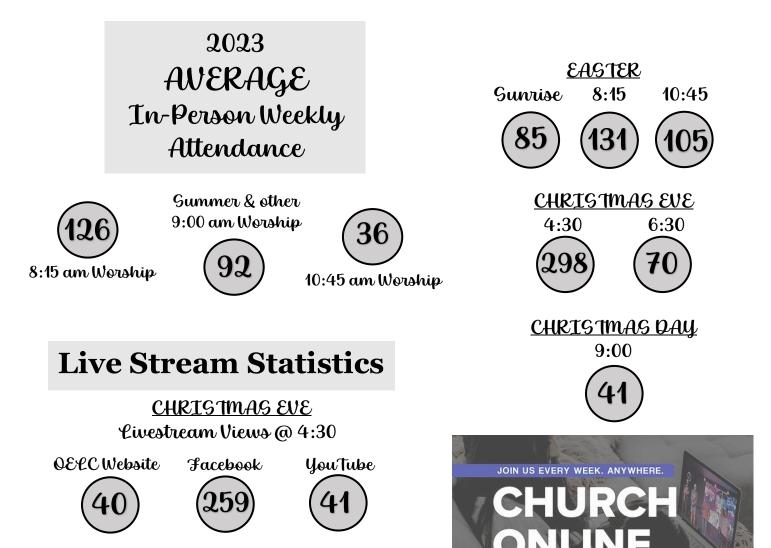

May it assure you of God's care and comfort when you and your loved ones are troubled. And may it remind you that you are always safe in the arms of Jesus, and that you are surrounded by the prayers of others."

This is one of the many prayers that our group of ladies in our Prayer Shawl Ministry pray as we gather monthly. Our group of 9 individuals bring a love of their craft of knitting and crocheting to this ministry, and we as a congregation are blessed to have them in our midst.

We resumed our regular monthly meetings in 2023 as we returned to normal, after several years of dealing with covid and adhering to that protocol. The return of the presentation of Baptismal shawls during our regular church services was also welcomed by many of our church family. Our monthly gatherings took to the outdoors during the summer months, when possible, to meet at the Osseo Nickel who graciously accommodated our gatherings. We offer our thanks to Curt Nelson and his family for this outdoor gathering space for us to meet occasionally.

During 2023, 21 adult shawls, 22 Baptismal shawls and 3 Youth shawls were presented to individuals recovering from illness or accidents, moments of sadness, as well as those joyful moments of Baptism. Our cousins to the Prayer Shawls, the "Prayer Cloths" have been flying out of the Prayer basket by the hundreds, and we are so grateful that they are being sent along to bless others in our church families and community.

Since our ministry began in 2011, the cost of yarn has increased significantly along with changes in the types of yarn that we prefer to use for Prayer Shawls. Our ministry is solely funded by generous monetary donations through memorials, THRIVANT CHOICE dollars and general giving from the heart. As always, we are frugal with our yarn purchases and are always watching for sales and using discounts whenever possible to make the best use of your kind and thoughtful monetary contributions. Thank you so much for your donation to the Osseo Tri County Food Pantry. Whether gifts of money, food, organizing food drives, recommending us for grants, or volunteering to help, YOU play an essential role in the on-going success of the food pantry.

Osseo Tri County Food pantry will begin 30 years of operation starting in February of 2024. The mission remains the same; to quietly serve people with food insecurity in the Osseo area. This year we served 1,162 people, with a total of over 63,000 pounds of food.

We always try to have enough main staples kept on hand for all guests. This makes it possible for people to plan their food dollars accordingly knowing these items will be available each month. Obtaining meat and sources of protein are a main priority for our food dollars. Of course, there many other items available, but these can vary each month. We do take advantage of food rescue from area businesses, and purchase most of our food from Feed My People. This year there have been very few grants available.

The food pantry depends on a dedicated group of core of volunteers and donations from individuals, churches, businesses, clubs and groups. This means YOU! Thank you for sharing your blessings with your neighbors. All gifts no matter how large or small are very much appreciated.

# W/ELCA Report

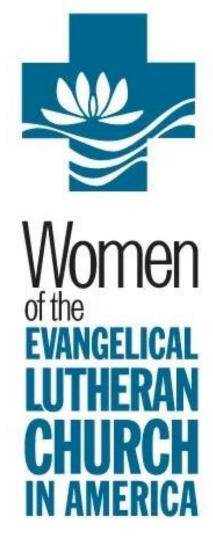

# **Endowment Fund Committee Report**

In 2023, the Endowment Fund Committee began by welcoming newly elected three-year member Dennis Barka.

The next order of business was to determine the amount of funds available for distribution, following the guidelines outlined in the fund's resolution. Based on the fund's performance in 2022, the committee recommended 4% and was approved for distribution of \$52,093.22. It was determined that past year's unused allotments of \$23,277 could be used also, making the total for 2023 be \$75,370.22.

The committee once again reached out to OELC high school seniors who wished to apply for college scholarships in 2023. Three OELC youth were awarded scholarships based on their academic achievements, extracurricular activities, and contributions to OELC. Endowment funds also paid for the Boiler System Glycol Replacement recommended by Hovland's.
