

# Signs Abound in the Gospel of John

The book of signs. That's how many refer to John's version of the life and times of God incarnate, Jesus Christ. It is, in my opinion, a helpful thing that signs abound throughout John's gospel because when Jesus speaks in this Gospel the speeches are often times long and rather complicated to follow. That's the power of signs isn't it? That they can convey in a few words or less what otherwise can become too lengthy and complicated to write out.



In our church we have employed signs at several crossroads within the hallways, on specific doors, and other notable places throughout the building. The problem is not that we don't see the value in signs. The problem is that some of our signage has not kept up with the growth of our

campus. We have entire additions to the building that are not even mentioned in our current signage.



An example of the need for updating the signs that direct members, visitors, workers, emergency personnel, children, etc. is the fact that at the main entrance



we have no signs that indicate we even have a gymnasium, youth room, chapel, library, or Sunday School wing.

With that issue in mind Molly and I have spent some time compiling a list of places in the church that could be added to our current signage locations as well as identifying more specific areas, offices, restrooms with additional signs on or near entrances. With that in mind we have printed and posted temporary paper signs to help us all determine if we are thinking of all the different places someone may be in search of when visiting our church.

Here is where you can help. I would appreciate your time spent wandering the hallways of our buildings as if you were a

visitor in search of a specific place. Please let us know if



we have missed any places within the church that could use updated signage.

Sisters and brothers, the elephant hasn't left the room. In the upcoming days and weeks, THAT issue is going to be the subject of discussion and a special congregational meeting at OELC: money. We've made it this far in the budget year without having to make use of our line-of-credit at a local bank, but unless something dramatic happens, we'll soon be borrowing money for the general budget to pay the bills, incurring interest.

Your council leadership continues to look for ways to close the gap between revenues and expenses. Some expenses the church has are not discretionary; utilities cost what they cost. The church itself has maintenance issues typical of a 50-year-old building. We as a congregation are called to continue our ministries and outreach to one another, the community, and the world. Believe me when I say that the leaders and staff are conscious of our duty to be good stewards with the offerings from those who consider this their church home. But as I've commented before, we don't sell hamburgers or widgets, so it's tough to simply raise prices to generate more income.

Neither Pastor Terry nor I know who gives what in offerings. We believe this avoids any tendency to interact with people based on dollar signs. Speaking for myself, I've never been a fan of the traditional emphasis on tithing; it's much different for someone making \$30,000 a year to give \$3,000 than for someone making \$300,000 to give \$30,000. There are also a wide variety of personal and family dynamics that affect finances, so the "one size fits all" approach based solely on a percentage of gross income doesn't make much sense to me.

Instead, what might be a fair barometer is disposable income. Disposable income is the money that's left after the necessary bills and other obligations are paid. It's the extra money you have to get from payday to payday. The amount is obviously going to vary for everyone and will vary from month to month. I'm asking each person who attends OELC to consider what percentage of disposable income they give to the church, and whether that can be increased. It's not about cancelling family vacations or avoiding eating at restaurants. It's about whether what OELC provides you and your family and the communities of this area is important enough for you to boost your giving as you are able. If it's not, the upcoming discussions also include ways to provide feedback if you have questions or concerns about what's happening at OELC.

I think we're doing great ministry here, though there's always room to do more. But to do more, or even to maintain where we are, it's going to take collaboration from everyone. Please involve yourself in the meetings and conversations, and prayerfully consider how you might respond to this very important need.
