Would you be willing to help me with a sermon?



He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon. They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them.

Then he looked up at his disciples and said: 'Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. 'Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled. 'Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh. 'Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.

'But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. 'Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry.

'Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. 'Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.

Luke 6:17-26

The passage above is the gospel reading for Sunday, February 13th, a Sunday right around the time you should have received the February edition of our church's monthly newsletter and, hopefully, had some time to read it. It is also the gospel reading for a Sunday that I am scheduled to preach during Sunday morning worship.

It is not typical for me to think about and plan for a sermon this far in advance. Quite frankly, I've never had the luxury of being able to think much beyond a week ahead but with the addition of an Associate Pastor I now find myself blessed with more time to think and plan for worship, bible study, confirmation and most every other thing a week's list of duties entails. For this I am very grateful.

With the blessing of this newly paced arrangement, I would like to use this space every now and then to invite you into the preparation of a sermon. By this I mean that it would be very interesting, and helpful I believe, for me to have you read the passage and let me know what your thoughts, questions, and comments might be on the text.

I would be interested in your initial observations and questions, your comments, or past experiences with the text, and perhaps even the things that bother you about the text.

Pastors commonly do this kind of preparation and work with other pastors, online or in person, on a weekly basis. I thought it would be rewarding to try it with the members of our congregation who are faithfully trying to find meaning in God's holy word for the lives they live here in this place.

Using the text from above, here are some questions/comments that came to mind for me when I first read it:

- Why does Jesus' come down to a level place to deliver his "beatitudes" sermon as opposed to delivering it up on the mountain as is indicated in Matthew's gospel?
- Why does Luke separate the crowd into disciples and people of the surrounding area?
- Why do "blessings" sound so unlikely and "woes" sound so unfair?

A Few Words from Our Sponsor

Many years ago, I picked up a pocket-sized book called *Martin Luther's Little Instruction Book: A Classic Treasury of Timeless Wisdom and Reflection* (copyright 1996; Honor Books, Tulsa, OK). The title is almost longer than some of the quotes gathered from the father of the Lutheran faith. Not all of what Luther wrote, and he wrote a great deal, is or should be retained over the centuries; he wrote some nasty and unfortunate essays, particularly late in life, that the ELCA and other Lutheran denominations have distanced themselves from and apologized for. But Luther had a quick mind and a deep, if often biting, wit, and some of his quotes stand the test of time. Among a few, asking you to pardon retaining the male gender usage:

- "God creates out of nothing. Therefore, until a man is nothing, God can make nothing out of him."
- "Farewell to those who want an entirely pure and purified church. This is plainly wanting no church at all."
- "Man is by nature unable to want God to be God. Indeed, he himself wants to be God, and does not want God to be God."
- "If a man could make a single rose, and empire should be given him. But, because of their commonness, innumerable gifts of God are not appreciated."
- "When I would speak and pray to God by myself, a hundred thousand hindrances at once intervene before I get at it."
- "Whatever your heart clings to and confides in, that is really your God."
- "A Christian is a free lord of all and subject to no one. A Christian is a ministering servant of all and subject to everyone."

Luther is even responsible for a comment that sounds very modern and is perhaps more poignant in today's world than the world of the 16th century: "The devil should not be allowed to keep all the best tunes for himself." Maybe that's why Luther used an old tavern song as the music for "Ein Feste Berg," the tune we know as "A Mighty Fortress is Our God." I'm not going to interpret or comment on these quotes; I offer them for you to consider for yourselves. We who call ourselves Lutherans can feel fortunate to have had a wise, faithful, moderately irreverent ancestor whose prolific writings can offer thoughtful consideration.

Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." –Matthew 22:37-40

What a shame that February – the one month of the year with keen focus on love – is also the shortest. We sure could use a lot more love in our world, especially for our neighbor.

The last 12 months have been particularly hard, as race riots, a divisive election and civil unrest have all unfolded against a traumatic backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic. The greater the "love for neighbor" factor in our lives, the better stewards we will be of every blessing God provides – creation, time, relationships, money, possessions, health, to name just a few. By cultivating love for neighbor, we will also enjoy a happier life and promote a healthier and more civil society.

The opposite is also true. Cultivating enmity for neighbor leaves us sour, selfish, and cynical, while also making our nation angry and selfish.

This year make February "Love Your Neighbor" month in your personal devotions and your congregational life. Give the concept breathing room in your life. Keep it in your thoughts, sow it in our heart, talk about it to your family and friends.

Pray for God to teach you what it means to love our neighbor. Pray for God to give you the strength and will to live it. And watch as love heals and invigorates your life ... and our world.




