OELC FRIENDSHIP CLUB SEEKING INPUT FOR 2021 OUTING

Our Friendship Club is looking for input on an outing we hope to put together before the end of 2021. Below are a few suggestions that we



came up with that are within a day's travel - to and from. If you have other suggestions we'd certainly consider them as well. Once we've decided on a destination, we'll be in search of a place to stop after the exhibit for lunch. These outings are open to folks in the congregation as well as friends and family.

#1 JAMES J HILL HOUSE

Built in late 1800s and was the largest and most expensive home in MN Extravagant wood carvings all over, rich in history, just a really cool house. Located on historic Summit Ave. Tours are guided and timed and currently participants have to wear a mask during the tour. \$10 each for seniors

#2 SCIENCE MUSEUM

Currently the special exhibit is Days of Dinosaurs. It features brand-new exhibits, movies, live experiences, open paleontology labs, as well as the recently expanded Dinosaurs & Fossils gallery. Senior rate is \$17. Masks are required

#3 MINNEAPOLIS INSTITUTE OF ART

Free, currently advanced reservations are not required (a few times during COVID they've required reservations) MIA has over 90,000 artworks, Mia's collection includes art from six continents, spanning about 5,000 years. Masks strongly encouraged, but currently not required.

#4 MN HISTORY CENTER

Three featured exhibits right now: Sinclair Lewis, Extraordinary Women, and Native Minnesota \$10 Senior admission There's also an semi-permanent exhibit that may be particularly of interest. It's on the third flood and it's called Minnesota's Greatest Generation. This exhibit beckons visitors to explore the generation's accomplishments, sacrifices, disappointments, challenges, and enduring legacy."

#5 MCNEELY CONSERVATORY (COMO ZOO)

Free, but advance reservations are required. Currently the zoo & conservatory are set up as a one-way walking path. The zoo is first but if you wish to skip it there is a marked shortcut you can take soon after entering. Masks required.

Note: we did consider adding the Eagle Center in Wabasha, MN but it is closed from October 25, 2021, to Spring of 2022 for extensive remodeling.

Please let us know if you have a preference for one of the above outing suggestions or if you have another idea you like us to check into. It may be possible, if the logistics work out, for us to visit more than one exhibit while we're in the area.

"39 years ago, I said to Virginia Haugen, you know, this church really should host a meatball dinner."

That was the first thing Pastor Roger Benrud, who was next in the queue for the most recent Harvest Dinner, said to me when he rolled down his driver's side window. And then with his slightly crooked smile appearing on his face he turned and glanced behind his car at too many more to count and then ahead to the few that stood between him and enjoying the fruits of his long-ago suggestion. "Enjoy the evening.", he said. And he was gone.

The steady flow of incoming cars coupled with my assigned duties of dividing and directing traffic kept me from pondering the suggestion to 'enjoy the evening' much for the next two hours of busyness. It was finally, upon reentering our church from the north side when my work was done and making my way to towards the fellowship hall, that I realized the true wisdom of Pastor Benrud's advice.

Tables had been knocked askew from their impromptu workstation arrangements, emptied roasting pans were scattered here and there, backpacks belonging to kids who had come right from school to help lined the pews in the narthex, and the remains of supplies used to pack dinners-to-go lay about. In short, the church showed signs of use and life such as we don't often see. I do not know how many cars came through our two makeshift drive-thru lanes, but I am told that we fed just shy of 986 people in less than 2 hours. That sort of pace, my friends, inherently produces a sort of controlled chaos. It is a welcomed version of chaos, such as when family comes home for the holidays or when friends stop by unannounced and take us out of our normal routines to enjoy the pleasure of their company for as long as it will last.

For me personally, the greatest part of enjoying the evening was listening to the sound of God's people just being together. There were young and old, men and women, long-time helpers and first-time helpers all sharing in the blessings of hard work, laughter, service, reunion, tiredness, excitement, and gratefulness. I stood outside the fellowship hall longer than I needed to, but I was taken up in the moment. I thought to myself, he was right nearly 40 years ago and he's still right, this church really should host a meatball dinner. Thanks to our dedicated Harvest Dinner Committee members and to the many, many faithful other helpers who work so well together we are able to continue to do so and bless our community with a very enjoyable evening indeed.
