I recently saw a post on Facebook which quoted two verses from chapter 28 of Deuteronomy that are part of a long warning from Moses regarding the consequences of the Israelites disobeying God. The two verses mention alien residents gaining influence and financial gain while the Israelites lose those items, and other nations ruling over Israel. Though it doesn't say so outright, the thinly veiled implication of the Facebook post is that the Bible predicts that immigrants will take over nations and control the culture, an attitude that has in recent years increasingly become the basis for anti-immigration prejudice in the US.

This post is a misuse of scripture, as it "cherry-picks" two verses out of the over 600 laws God gave to Moses and tries to force them to fit the interpretation one person wants others to believe. However, in context, Moses is telling the people, "If you Israelites disobey God's commands and worship other gods and idols, then resident aliens and other nations will reap the benefits you're rejecting through your disobedience." If Israel is conquered by other nations and the crops fail, the blame goes to the misdeeds of the Israelites, not of the resident aliens or immigrants.

What the post also conveniently ignores is that verses elsewhere in Deuteronomy disagree with its conclusion. The laws of Moses that refer to resident aliens and strangers include: paying their wages on time; providing them food and clothing; setting aside part of the harvest for them; especially ensuring them justice; leaving of crops in the fields and vineyards for them; and many others. More than once, Moses says, "Remember that you were strangers in the land of Egypt."

I don't know all of my genealogy, but I know that my maternal grandfather was the first of his family to be born in the US. On my dad's side, my grandmother's grandparents came over from Norway. Unless of Indigenous heritage, I would suspect most American citizens are less than a handful of generations removed from immigrant ancestors.

The blather that immigrants are coming here to take our jobs and drain the welfare system has no basis in reality. It's a scare tactic being used by people who are afraid that the power that Northern European descendants have had for centuries in this country might be coming to an end in favor of more equity for people of all heritages. Instead of fighting immigration, perhaps we can embrace it as a chance to broaden our understanding of the "neighbor" Jesus called—no, commanded us to love. And as Bill Cosby used to say at the start of his Saturday morning cartoon show, "You just might learn something before you're through." Blessings,
