Above are three of the five requests, verbatim, that came to me via email or text message in the first couple weeks of our 8th Grade Confirmation Class here at OELC. The other two students who expressed their desire to attend and explore confirmation came when the fourth student simply announced that he was going to be a part of the class and fifth just showed up, unannounced. Just so you know, it's not uncommon to pick up a student or two as the year goes along, but to have five young people initiate entry into the class **on their own** because they are curious and looking for answers – is something that has NEVER happened to me in almost thirty years of teaching confirmation. I think it best not to question why this has happened. I think it best to give thanks for the unpredictable and surprising nature of the Spirit and try, as best we can, to follow where we are being led.

So, we have welcomed the following students to our class: Henry Cash, Addison Olsen, Holden McKray, Davian Diaz, and Adysson Curtis. They join Dalton Clark, Aidan Everson, Alexis Ness, Jianna Scheffer, Kierra Sieg, Ty Skoyen, Sophie Pernsteiner, and Izzy Kuehn and myself as we explore the bible, God's presence in our lives, the church, our faith, and whatever else the Spirit has in mind for us to consider. We are all curious, no matter our age, so we will imagine, struggle, wonder, question and otherwise consider what God has done, is doing, and will continue to do in the name of Jesus Christ. It is an exciting, unique year already - and we have only just begun.

Settle in for story time. In the model of the popular late journalist Paul Harvey, let me tell you about Bessie. Bessie was born in the state of Georgia just before the turn of the 20th century. She volunteered to serve as a nurse in the US Army in 1917, but the program was cancelled. Instead, she followed in her father's footsteps, working for the US Postal Service. In 1923 she completed her nursing degree and was married that same year. She and her husband raised four children, two boys and two girls before he died 30 years later. At a time when segregation was the norm in the US, especially the South, Bessie, a White woman, regularly allowed Black friends and neighbors to enter her house through the front door and sit in the living room for conversation. She said she was inspired by her father, who was friendly with and dined with Black co-workers at the Post Office. Bessie theoretically "retired" from nursing in 1925 but provided medical care as a quasi-nurse practitioner for her community and the hundreds of employees in her husband's business.

Bessie's husband died of pancreatic cancer in 1953. She became house mother for a fraternity at Auburn University for six years, then managed a nursing home in another Georgia town. In 1966, at the age of 68, Bessie volunteered to join the Peace Corps. After three months of training, she was sent to a leprosy complex near Mumbai (then known as Bombay), India. In the 21 months she spent at the complex, as she closed in on her 70th birthday, Bessie learned a difficult life lesson about herself and the gospel message of Jesus. At first, she was highly fearful of contact with the patients. In a poem she wrote about the time, she described how after her first interaction with a young girl with the disease, she "slipped away to be alone and scrubbed my entire body red and raw." She admitted that she "faced her treatment every week with dread and loathing, for the chore, not the child." Yet as the treatments continued and the young girl's sores faded, their relationship eventually became filled with love, "so that when I kissed her lips, I didn't feel unclean."

Bessie broke through the barrier of her fear, just as two thousand years prior Jesus broke through similar biases regarding outcasts and rejected community members. As Christ's disciples, we are called to follow his example by sharing our presence with all of our neighbors, including those who may not be pleasant or feel 100% safe to be around. That's a tall order, no question. The AIDS/HIV epidemic that began in 1981 and the more recent COVID pandemic are vivid examples of how we can be overwhelmed by what we don't know and are still subject to marginalizing people whom we fear.

Besides medical issues, there are multiple reasons humans create walls between one another: skin color, heritage, gender, identity, lifestyle, age, religious beliefs, political beliefs, financial stability, and others. What barriers can we as Christians, sent by the one who reached out to all, break down? How can we be like Miss Bessie Lillian Carter, the warm, charming, and sassy mother of former President Jimmy Carter, who overcame her fear, and after returning from India, gave lectures across the country encouraging people not to let anything prevent them from reaching out in love to a neighbor? Look around. The possibilities are there.

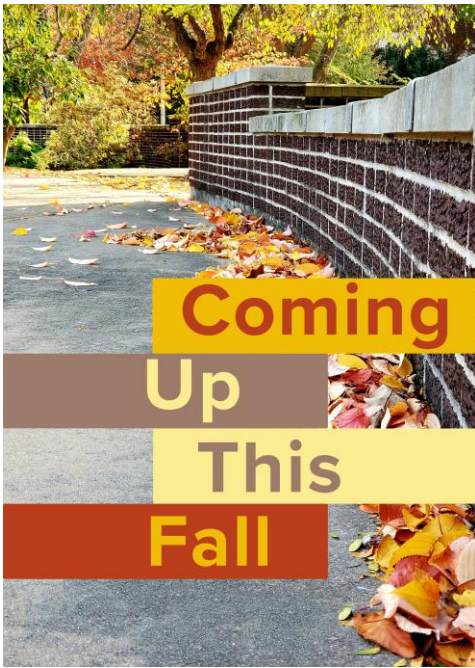

How do I start? *Follow a few simple steps.*

For security purposes, connecting with Realm starts with an invitation. As we begin this broader rollout, you will receive an email titled "Please Complete Realm Registration" (check your spam filter if you don't see it). There will be a link in that email which will guide you through the process. If you don't receive one or are new to our church, please contact the office so that we can send you a link. oelc@triwest.net, 715-597-3213

We are here for YOU! *Can you help me get signed up?*

Yes, if you are not "tech comfortable," you can call, email, or stop by the church office anytime, Monday-Thursday, 8am-4pm. For those who want to give it a try on their own, there will be tutorials available online and printed copies in the church office.

What about Privacy? *Your information is your information.*

1. You have complete control over who can see your contact and personal information.
2. Contact information is never public or searchable on the Internet. Any information you elect to make visible to your church family is always protected behind a login.
3. Authorized staff will always have access to your profile information.
4. You and certain authorized staff may update your profile information. In some cases, your group leader may update your contact information if you have made it visible to group leaders.
5. For safety reasons, sharing contact and personal information for children under 18 is limited. Parents determine whether or not to display their child's name in the church directory.
6. Children under 13 may not participate and will not be able to sign in.
