"You put one hand over the other...you know, like you're making your hands into a little cradle to receive Christ as a human born among us."

It's a humble, unpretentious response to a staggering act of love initiated by the Author of the universe. The gospel writer John records the other John (the Baptizer) declaring that at the very moment the newborn Jesus Christ drew his first breath among us "the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." and the manner in which humankind relates to God Almighty has been forever changed.

I find myself most often saying it to the children of God who are taking part in our First Communion class here at OELC. Come to God's table, lift up your heads, open your hands wide, place them one over the other and prepare to receive what is holy, God incarnate.

It is a unique claim made by most all of Christianity - that God became one of us and experienced all that we can experience,

yet he was without sin. I suggest that incarnation broadens our consideration of all that goes into celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. The incarnation of God makes all things that are of this world holy.

Certainly all things that have been created by God are holy but all things, including the whole of a divine being living as a fully human being, have been made holy by the presence of God in Jesus Christ in our world.

Let me try to put this in a more humble, unpretentious way. This Christmas simply put one hand over the other...you know, like a cradle and receive the Christmas letters & cards, the cookies, the wonderful music, the opportunity to care for and include others, the unexpected gifts...and, of course, the body and blood of God incarnate whose holiness is present among us still.

When I first arrived at OELC in September of 2021, I had meetings with both adults and youth to hear their thoughts on where the youth program should go. The unanimous opinion was to re-connect with Appalachia Service Project and get a mission trip planned. We were able to send nine youth and four adults to Kentucky this past July. Preparations are already underway for a 2023 mission trip, scheduled for June 25 to July 2. While we won't know our destination until the spring, ASP's theme for summer 2023 has been announced: "Love strong." The theme is taken from Luke 10:27:

"He said, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself."

These words are often called "The Greatest Commandment," since that's how Jesus used them in Matthew and Mark. But in this particular passage, the "He said" doesn't refer to Jesus. It's an expert in Jewish law who asked Jesus a question, Jesus responded by asking what the scriptures say, and the man answers with the verse above. The law expert then asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" prompting the parable of the Good Samaritan.

As I thought about ASP's choice of using this passage versus the "Greatest Commandment" stories, I was struck by the poignancy. I think we can find a deep connection between this Luke text and what an ASP mission trip is all about. The expert is trying to narrow the category of "neighbor," since if our neighbor is more like us, it's easier to love them. Samaritans as a group were viewed negatively by Jews, and any individual would be judged based on the feelings about the group. The Samaritan was an unlikely hero compared to the priest and the Levite, who as "religious people" and Jews would be expected to give care. The Samaritan performed tangible actions and used his own money to give aid and offered to do more if needed.

We all have our definition of neighbor. It may mean folks next door or within a couple blocks, and they generally are a lot like us. It rarely stretches for the 800 miles between Osseo and Kentucky. Many people have pre-conceived notions about the families ASP serves, most of those images negative, and individuals are often judged based on the whole group. I, for one, am a very unlikely person to offer home construction, but it's a tangible act I can perform in service to others.

At the end of the parable, Jesus turns the expert's question "Who is my neighbor?" sideways. Rather than giving a direct answer, Jesus asks the man, "Which of these do you think was [i.e., <u>acted</u> like] a neighbor" to the man on the road? When the expert answers "The one who showed him mercy," Jesus says, "Go and do likewise." If you or someone you know is a youth in grades 9-12 in 2022-2023 and want to "go and do likewise" with us next June, or if you have questions about the ASP trip, please contact me right away. We have room for some adult chaperones as well!

OELC offers several opportunities to honor a loved one, commemorate a special occasion or celebrate a milestone.



3rd Saturday of the Month At Osseo Rural Fire Station behind Stockman's 10:00-11:00 am






