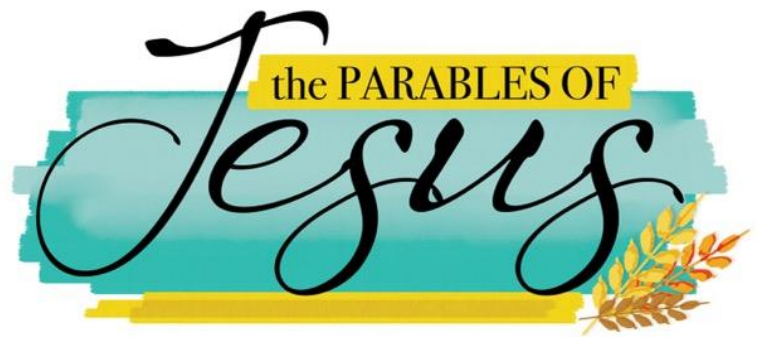
As you make plans to enter into the difficult days of Holy Week and the victorious days of resurrection, we offer the following worship opportunities:

## Wednesday Worship Resumes with Sermon Series On



Wednesday Worship will resume on April 20<sup>th</sup> by kicking off a 6-week sermon series on the Parables of Jesus.

Jesus, or rabbi as those first disciples occasionally called him, was indeed a powerful teacher who knew the effectiveness of a good story. Many of the stories he was inclined to share were touching, poignant stories of a familiar teaching that, in his retelling, were laid alongside of a new, deeper understanding of God's kingdom.

A story of a farmer who plants seeds as if he doesn't know farming at all becomes a new way to understand God's gracious abundance, a strained and broken relationship between a benevolent father and a wayward son speak clearly of God's patience and commitment to his own children, or an account of the troubles a farmer can know when dealing with the problem of weeds becomes a dissertation on the complexity of judging another's sin – these are just some of the parables that Jesus used to announce the coming kingdom of his Father in heaven. This series will take us through Memorial Day weekend when we will break for the summer months. Please join us for our casual, abbreviated Wednesday Worship services in the chapel starting at 6 p.m.

## Easter Message from Bishop Laurie Skow-Anderson - April 2022

*2 Corinthians 5:17 So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!*

Dear Northwest Synod of Wisconsin,

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! This is the good news of Easter. By God's power death is reversed and Christ is raised from the dead. Jesus' resurrection from the dead changes everything! Everything is made new.

Change is good news after two years of a pandemic, right? We are ready for a change. But are we really? Do we want everything to become new like we read in 2 Corinthians 5 or do we want the change to be a return to the old and familiar?

If Jesus' resurrection from the dead changes everything, then what has changed in your life? What difference does Jesus make in your life?<sup>1</sup> What has Jesus made new?

- What difference does Jesus make to my 35 year old nephew whose brain tumor came back, faces radiation treatments and is struggling with his ex for visitation of their three year old son?
- What difference does Jesus mean to our siblings in Malawi who are often threatened by drought, flood and famine or to Ukrainians whose homes were destroyed by a Russian bomb?
- What difference does Jesus make to a stable congregation deciding what their next most faithful step might be or to a declining congregation wondering if their next most faithful step is to close?

As Lutherans we believe that we are baptized into Christ's death and resurrection, we go under the water as a sinner and we are resurrected with Christ, lifted out of the water, a saint. We are changed for sure and we are reborn children of God! Theologically that's beautiful, but in real life, what difference does Jesus make in your life?

As human beings, Christ's resurrection from the dead challenges us to live into that change. As broken sinful humans, whose lives are "messed or mangled"<sup>1</sup> we live into Easter reality that Christ is present and daily working in our lives. Jesus challenges and changes us. Those of us who doubt our faith and question its relevance are challenged by Easter's promise to see and know God in the transformed lives around us.

Friends we know that Jesus changes our weeping into laughing, our mourning into dancing, our despair into hope, our winter into spring and our death into life. Jesus changes things and makes all things new. We are challenged to see the transformations around us and in us. We are challenged to be the change, evidence of the transformation, for the world to see and know God through us.

## MAUNDY THURSDAY WORSHIP TO INCLUDE SEDER MEAL

You are invited to join us in OLEC's **Fellowship Hall** for a very special Seder Meal and Maundy Thursday worship service held on April 14<sup>th</sup> at 6 p.m. Those gathered will engage in the rituals associated with the Passover meal Jesus shared with his disciples on the night of the Last Supper. The meal will include traditional foods and the meanings behind them. Also included will be the ancient song of thanksgiving for deliverance from captivity, "Dayenu". The meal will end with the celebration of Holy Communion, pointing followers of Jesus Christ to the Lamb who was slain for us on the cross. This worship service is intended to be a respectful, faithful, and informative way to connect our faith with that of our Jewish brothers and sisters. Please note that this is a meal more focused on the fullness of meaning and remembrance than of fullness of belly. Also, we are in need of folks who would be willing to help provide and prepare from recipes detailing foods that are a part of the meal and how they are to be served. ### 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself,<sup>[a]</sup> not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

## ***Easter Stewardship: Resurrection Reset***

*Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore, we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. -Romans 6:3-4*

Christ is Risen! Risen, indeed! Alleluia!

The triumphant words we cherish every Easter signal more than just Jesus' victory over the grave. They announce for us the end of deadness and the start of a new life, a fresh beginning, in our earthly pilgrimage. Jesus was raised from the dead so that we, too, might walk in newness of life.

From Jesus' resurrection, our lives take on a new trajectory, a turn away from the values and precepts of the world and toward the kingdom of God. As we walk, our lives progressively align with the purposes and mission of God.

For a steward-disciple of our Lord, the implications are many. As we walk in newness of life, we might find ourselves

- Re-examining our relationship to “stuff” – our money, our possessions, the things that might have given us a sense of security or worth. Jesus is our security and our worth.
- Drawing closer to family and friends. True wealth is measured by the love we give and receive. Our lives effervesce with the love we receive from God.
- Contributing more to church and charity. Jesus frees us from the grip that possessions have upon us. We can more freely give.
- Gathering into our lives what Paul calls the fruits of the spirit: “Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control” (Galatians 5:22-23).

May your lives as steward-disciples take a resurrection reset. Christ is risen! Risen indeed! Alleluia!

## ***Memorial Given in Support of Live Streaming Ministry***

OELC was recently the recipient of a generous memorial which will allow us to expand our live streaming capabilities by adding another camera a switcher, an additional tripod, and all the hardware needed to install everything. This gift was given in loving memory of Alvin & Doris Pederson by their son, Les Pederson.

With the implementation of this gift, we will be able to enhance the broadcasting of our worship services via the BoxCast platform we are currently using.

Adding another camera will help us to better cover activity throughout the entire sanctuary from two different angles. The switcher will enable us to seamlessly toggle back and forth between cameras as well as incorporate announcements on slides at the beginning of the services and offer helpful titling during the worship service.

According to our latest Annual Report live streamed worship services at OELC in 2021 garnered just under 2500 BoxCast views from folks in 3 different countries and 28 different U.S. states, 64 Facebook followers, and 6,100 views on YouTube. Online worship participation continues to grow in amazing ways, and we are grateful to Les for his memorial given in loving memory of his parents and in support of this fledgling ministry.
