Tuesday, April 5, 2022 – The Tough Jesus, Temple Cleansing Time reading: Mark 11:12-19

Tuesday, May 3, 2022 – The Tender Jesus, "Jesus wept" reading: John 11:1-44

Tuesday, June 7, 2022 – The Triumphant Jesus, Jesus' death reading: Luke 23:44-49

A new year often creates poetic writings of blank slates and white canvases. Such messages sometimes tend to be over the top, but as OELC enters a new calendar year, these notions hold some truth. After the months lost to the pandemic, and understanding that it is still a barrier, we want to find ways to gather as a community of faith again. And honestly, the canvas is fairly blank. We're not tied to the two phrases that cause so many problems in the church: "We've always done it that way," and "We've never done it that way."

The **OELC senior high youth** have been meeting in the newly designated Youth Room to have fellowship and think about the future. 10 youth, including friends who aren't members of OELC, enjoyed a Christmas party on December 12 that included music, games, food, and fun (the air hockey pucks were flying!). Thanks to those who attended, and to Traci Loonstra for providing walking tacos and Nolan Olson for bringing Christmas cookies. We'll continue to plan monthly events, and I'm open to ideas for a fellowship and/or service event for January or other upcoming months.

The **Youth Room** is available any time the church is open (just let someone know you're back there so we don't turn on the alarm system!). There's some furniture to sit in, the airhockey table, and now a full-sized ping-pong table (Thank you Paulus family!). I'm sure everyone knows how to be respectful of the room and the equipment, so just "do what's right."

We are registered for an **Appalachia Service Project** mission trip for July 2022. All indications are that we've been scheduled for our first choice of weeks, July 16-24. We'll learn our service site sometime in the Spring. As I write, 10 youth have said they're interested, which fills the two work crews we registered for. There are also four adult spots we'll need to fill, so anyone willing to chaperone can contact me! We're able to add crews as long as ASP has room, so if there are more senior high youth who want to go, or if you have any questions, let me know ASAP!

Thanks to Ryan and Nolan Olson, "**OELC Youth**" has a page on **Discord** that I'd like to use for keeping in contact, sending out announcements, and just saying hello. Please go to the Discord site and add yourself to the group, then tell friends to join in as well. As with all OELC youth events, folks don't need to be members to be involved!

Families of Sunday School kids, keep your eyes and ears open for information on Summer Camp at Luther Park in Chetek for the summer of 2022. There are opportunities for Day Camp (completed K-3), two-night Discovery Camp (grades 1-3), a few five-day camps focused on experiencing the outdoors (grades 3-5), and single weeks for a music, art, drama, and dance (MADD) camp and a basketball camp (both grades 4-7). 2022: Your year for GENEROSITY

"You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity!" -2 Corinthians 9:11

As you make resolutions and set goals for the New Year, be sure to include this one: "I will be more generous in 2022." It will bless you — and your community and neighbor!

The Bible makes clear that generosity leads to a more abundant life. Generous people experience one of those paradoxes of the Kingdom of God, where the last are first, the greatest is servant to all, and whoever loses her life for Christ will gain it.

The paradox? Generous people get back far more they give.

First, a clarification: The paradox is NOT a financial strategy to maximize return on investment. That would be missing the point. Besides, there are more important things to give than money, such as time, service, kindness, forgiveness, compassion, love, and joy. And what we get back may not be quantifiable. How do you measure wellbeing and happiness?

Generosity's real "payback" is what and who we become when we cultivate a habit of giving. Giving transforms us into generous-hearted people, and generous-hearted people tend to experience a real abundance of joy, peace, love, and security.

The old saying is most certainly true: The open palm holds more than the closed fist.

For 2022, set a goal to be more generous. Start by increasing your charitable giving above last year's offering, but also aim to give away your time, to serve your neighbor, to be lavish in compassion, extravagant in love.

Pray that God will guide you and help you experience the paradox: Givers get back more than they give away.

The Nominating Committee is seeking candidates to stand for election for 3 three-year terms on the Congregation Council, as well as three members to serve as representatives to the synod assembly next May, two members to serve as representatives on the OELC Endowment Committee, two-four members to join the Personnel Committee (to assist and advise the Council on matters of personnel administration), two-four members to join the Stewardship/Finance Committee and two new Nominations Committee members, to assist next year's outgoing Council members in this same work.

Of these roles, serving on the Council is perhaps the most "time-intensive," and yet even these leaders serve only a few hours each month: one 60–120-minute meeting, the 2nd Wednesday of each month, after 30-60 minutes of meeting preparation and review, plus serving on various work groups or committees, for another 30-60 minutes each month. A total commitment of less than five hours each month, and yet together, these leaders can support the works of countless volunteers and staff, all throughout our congregation.

We hope you'll hear this call and be moved to reach out. Preparations are being finalized this month for the upcoming election and activities for the annual meeting at the end of January. Are you ready to say "YES!"? Contact any member of the Nominating Committee: Brent McCune, Patty Hoffman, Linda Heiman, Vern Larson, or Shannon Hasz. They'd all be happy to answer questions or share their experiences. Don't delay any longer, your moment is now!
