As members in the body of Christ, we need only trust that God is with us and will provide.

#### January 2021 Bishop Laurie Skow-Anderson's Report to the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin

Dear Pastors, Deacons, SAMs, Council Presidents and Lay Leaders of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin.

On behalf of the synod council and the synod ministers, I want to express to you all my deepest appreciation and thanks for the hard work you've all done in the last nine months to keep your congregational members and neighbors safe during this unprecedented time in history. You made difficult decisions, adapted your ministry, improvised, experimented, and learned as fast as you could ways to connect with your people safely! Thank you for your

faithful ministry! You have been done extraordinary creative ministry even as you have been grieving all the losses we've experienced

this past year. Some have lost loved ones who have died from the coronavirus. Some are grieving the loss of weekly in-person worship and especially missed celebrating Easter and Christmas together, and others are grieving the loss of small group Bible Study, quilting, choirs or Sunday school. The stress, the fear, the grief, and the pressure to return to in-person worship has been exhausting. I know I'm tired of all of this and I'm sure you are too. There is hope. There is a vaccine. Soon, friends, we can return

to a more normal way of gathering. We must be patient a little longer and wait for the infection rate to drop and for more to receive the vaccine. I'm hosting a

synod wide Zoom meeting with Rev. Kerri Parker, Executive Director of the Wisconsin Council of Churches on Tuesday, February 2

This winter I've meet with about 25 church councils across our synod for prayer, devotions and a brief conversation before their regular meeting. During the conversation we talk about the real struggles they have had with the

> pandemic but we've also discussed the opportunities that the pandemic has presented them. At one of those meetings the congregation's treasurer

offering had continued to be so strong even though the church building was essentially closed. He said that for him, the opportunity was to learn that the church wasn't about the building really at all it was about so much more, the people and the people engaged in ministry outside the walls of the building. Your annual meeting is an opportunity to discuss your church's ministry beyond your building. Everyone is waiting for life after the pandemic.



By the rivers of Babylon - there we sat down and there we wept when we remembered Zion. On the willows there we hung up our harps. How could we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land?

Psalm 137



It seems to me that most of the year 2020, the year we are to consider at this annual meeting time, would easily fall into the category of being foreign. Foreign in the sense that it was strange and unfamiliar territory we wandered into along about mid-March. No one coming to the church for worship, no one coming to the church at all but for a handful who came periodically to check on a vacant, lifeless building. Ministries, meetings, mission trips, all had come to an abrupt and shocking halt. Outside the church, life in Osseo looked only slightly less foreign; empty schools, empty businesses, and many sequestering themselves in the hopeful safety of home.

The above words preserved in Psalm 137 are not unlike these words I share with you when reflecting on the year 2020. While we pause to consider the year that has gone by, the psalmist pauses to reflect on their community's time in exile in Babylon - apart from spending familiar days in familiar surroundings in their beloved Jerusalem which had been destroyed. How can we possibly do what we've always done when things are so foreign and restricted in Babylon and things are unrecognizable in our hometown the psalmist inquires of God. In the midst of their sadness and lamenting for being removed from the normal, God's people did what faithful people do - they trusted God to return them to their joy in time and, in the meantime, they vowed to remember and care about their blessed city of Jerusalem until such a day came.

That is precisely how I would summarize 2020 for the people of Osseo Evangelical Lutheran Church. We spent most of the year in what felt like a foreign land, we struggled to find a way to sustain normal routines, we were forced to learn to do some things a different way, we committed ourselves to caring for our beloved church not knowing when it would be fully ours again, we planned for the future by investing in several significant, long overdue maintenance projects, and above all – we trusted that God would, in time, lead us back from our modern-day exile and return us to the fullness of joy.

In time, God's time, the community of God was able to return to Jerusalem and set their hands to rebuilding their city and temple. In time, God's time, the community of Osseo Evangelical Lutheran Church will be able to return in fullness to our church and the work God has called us to in Jesus' holy name.

Thank you all for your faithful support this past year and for your bold investment in the future of our church.

#### **Report of the Church Council President**

God's Blessings to all of you. I hope this finds you well and you continue to stay well in these unprecedented times. I miss all of you and our regular Worship interactions of the past. I miss the greetings, I miss the handshakes, I miss the hugs, and I miss our fellowship hour. What a significant challenge of Faith, Fortitude and Perseverance for all of us this year. Yet, through this challenging year of 2020, as a Congregation, we stayed strong together in Faith and accomplished many remarkable things at OELC. I will highlight these accomplishments.

Thank you to the entire Church Staff, to our Church Council, and to You our members for all your tireless work and efforts to steer OELC in a continued positive and forward direction every day. God Bless you all.

In no particular order, here is a summary of just a few of the many accomplishments achieved at Osseo Evangelical Lutheran Church in 2020:

- Achieved budget for 2020 in a Pandemic year. The Church did not utilize our operating line of credit in 2020. Thank you all for your contributions to OELC.
- Balance sheet as of 11/30/2020: \$1,427,572 Assets-\$42,872 Liabilities (37,600 will be forgiven). Our Church is financially strong with a net asset position of \$1,422,300.
- Church Security-We have invested in a new Church Security System that includes video monitoring of all our main entrances and the back entrances of our Church. We have also established a security alarm protocol for the Church and have provided a key to the Osseo Police Department and the Osseo Fire Department for access to the Church in the event of an emergency.
- Our Chapel renovation is complete. Big thanks to our OELC staff and the Property Management Committee who did the heavy lifting here over the last 1.5 years.
- Our Call Committee continues to move ahead on the discernment process for our Associate Pastor. As of this writing, we do not have a candidate in focus. Please continue to pray for our Call Committee and for some traction here.
- We have 3 volunteers currently working to update our Church Constitution. Thank you to Dick Schermetzler, Melanie Gaulke, and Duke Anderson for your work here.
- Six OELC Scholarships were awarded to 2020 graduating Seniors.
- Ten 8<sup>th</sup> grade students were confirmed this fall.
- In April, with the decision made to close our Church entirely due to Covid-19, our Council voted in favor of taking advantage of the Cares Act Paycheck Protection Program to help support Church funding for payroll and utility expenses at a critical time of closure.
- OELC has invested the monies and time to provide "Live Streaming" Worship Services that will go forward indefinitely. Live Worship Streaming is working very well, and it provides another option or solution for Worship for our members.


- New heating system upgrade for the Church.
  - 1. State of the art control systems designed to be extremely user friendly and will improve both heating and cooling comfort in the Church.
  - 2. Reduce our overall energy use with the ease of scheduling, equipment monitoring and reporting.
- Organ restoration is underway with a completion date still to be determined. Dan Newman has been in regular contact with Robert Hoppe. Good progress is being made.
- Parsonage 2 was sold and closed in December. Thank you so much to the Hong family and to the Property Committee for an unbelievable effort to make this a reality in a 2-month period. The home is now a blessing to a Mother and Father with 4 children. The net proceeds of the sale will be directed to a liquid savings account and the remaining funds to go to our Endowment Fund.
- OELC worship will continue with one service at 9 AM. The plan, in God's time, will be to move back to our normal 2 regular services each Sunday.
- Our Flagship Worship Team will continue to provide Contemporary Services for OELC. These will be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of each month with this service held in our new Chapel at 10:30 AM.
- Since 8/30/2020, drive-up Communion is available to those who would like to participate in this fashion. A "thank you" to JoAnn and Bob Rongstad for sharing this excellent idea to our Church Council for adoption.
- 2020-2021 Sunday School year began with virtual learning beginning 9/13/2020. 25-30 minutes lessons available for our Sunday School kids. 3 classes 4k-5k class; 1,2,3<sup>rd</sup> grade class; 4,5 6<sup>th</sup> grade class. Thank you to Valerie Lorenz, Amy McCune, Vern Larson, Angie Hong, Samantha Anderson, Mia Nicolai and Lexi Mazur for their time and commitment to our Sunday School Program and to our kids.
- New Confirmation Class for 2020-2021 also began virtually. As is the hope for Sunday worship, in God's time, the intent is to bring our kids back to Church as soon as it is deemed appropriate.
- Wednesday Ignite Services are postponed at this time until further notice.
- 2020 Harvest Dinner (drive-up and pick-up only) was a tremendous success. We served 675 meals in 1 hour and 15 minutes. Crazy success! Thank you to our tremendous Harvest Dinner committee members and to all the volunteers who planned, worked, and served this event.

God continues to shed his blessings upon us. Let our light continue to shine and serve others well as we continue to go forward.

I have been involved in the preparation of the supper, but this year I was more involved with the meal. The committee had about 4-5 meetings to get everything set-up. On Oct. 9th we made meatballs. The committee leaders (listed above) all work very hard to make it turn out. They deserve a lot of credit and praise, especially with the circumstances this year. Also thanks to all the others who donated time or items. It took us all to make it work as a family would."

#### **Tri County Food Pantry 2020**

"I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me a drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me."

The Tri County Food Pantry has had a good but challenging year. We were fortunate to be able to stay open, but needed to change procedures to keep our volunteers and guests safe. Instead of coming into the food pantry and selecting

food, our guests drove up and prepacked food was placed into cars. This distribution system will continue until the health department deems it safe for us to allow entrance and self selection again.

Along with the drive through distribution, the ordering and procurement of food has changed. We do very little food rescue at this time; once a month from Lance's Grocery Store, and venison from Bushy's in Independence. At this time we cannot accept food from food drives. In the past, these food drives between Thanksgiving and Christmas kept the pantry well stocked until the Boy Scout and Postal Food drives in the spring. Last spring these two large food drives couldn't happen and they probably won't this year either. For this reason money donations are greatly appreciated.

This past year the Tri County Food pantry served 333 families, 827 individuals. We served 160 new people during the year and gave out 52,764 pounds of food. This could not be done without a dedicated group of volunteers. The food that goes out needs to come in and be prepacked, this requires many willing hands, strong backs and time.

A special thank you to all our dedicated volunteers. We appreciate your help and welcoming smiles. We need you. We also thank all individuals, groups, clubs and churches for gifts of money. We need you. We are also thankful to the Osseo Rural Fire Department and local taxpayers for allowing the use of accessible space in the new fire department.

Next year we hope to add an airflow system to the food pantry to help preserve the life of our commercial freezers during the summer months. We also would like to coat the cement floor with a sealer to keep it easier to clean. We are working on sponsors and grants to help with these two items.

If you, or you know of someone who needs help with food, the food pantry is open the third Saturday of each month from 10:00 to 11:00 am. The only questions asked are names, ages and address. We are open to anyone in the Osseo-Fairchild school district or for whom this is the nearest food pantry. But, no one is ever turned away.

Thank you for remembering our guests and the food pantry with your gifts and prayers. We need you.

Repairs/updates for our beautiful pipe organ were approved and funded thru the Endowment for 2019. The work to-date has been very well received with excellent workmanship. However, there have been manufacturing delays due to the Corona virus situation. Unfortunately, a larger delay factor for our organ contractor Robert Hoppe & Associates has been the death of Robert's mother, health issues that arose with his dad, and the ultimate passing of Robert's dad as well, all within a matter of months throughout the summer and fall. Needless to say, this has set back the work on the organ. On behalf of the OELC congregation, we have expressed our condolences to Robert and throughout stressed that family comes first.

Robert had indicated that component manufacturing of various items was nearly complete, but a recent update from an Ohio manufacturer indicated some concerns about potential shut downs due to a resurgence of the corona virus in that area. However, Robert indicates he will be here on a weekly basis going forward completing the work on the organ body, electronics, etc. with the swell box work coming later as dictated by the manufacturers.

Once complete, we can look forward to having the organ once again being a part of our worship!

In April 2020, the church received a Payroll Protection loan in the amount of \$37,600 to help pay our employees & their benefits and to also go towards utilities. If not for that amount of money, the final balance would not be positive.

#### **2021 OELC Missional Budget**

The tradition of providing an alternative to the line item budget for OELC members continues for 2021 with our fifth (5<sup>th</sup>) iteration of the Missional Budget. This form of budget was introduced to offer members an opportunity to see where their gifts were utilized. With the focus once again centered on OELC's mission statement, we have prepared examples of some of the highlights from 2020 in the mission and ministry areas that represent OELC.

We have followed these accomplishment examples with those areas that will be emphasized or focused on by your church leadership in the coming year. Without your financial contributions giving back to God, as well as the countless time and talents shared by you, none of this past years accomplishments, nor those in the coming year, were or are possible.

#### Our Plan of Ministry

#### A) We share our faith and bring people to Jesus Christ:

To say that 2020 has been an unusual year in the life of OELC would be a dramatic understatement due to the corona virus and the ensuing state and local government shut-downs. Your church council and staff have taken extraordinary measures to bring worship to the congregation in these times and we all look forward to the day when we can all gather again together as one body in Christ.

As such, regular Sunday worship services as well as the Flagship services were suspended for a period of time then resumed with a single regular service at 9:00 each Sunday and the Flagship service resuming twice a month at 10:30 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and last Sundays of the month. Many special services including Easter and Advent were and are canceled thru the end of the year to err on the side of caution.

There were 22 baptisms in 2020 and 10 new members were welcomed into the OELC family. Our Sunday school and confirmation classes have also been affected by the virus and continue on virtual basis thru the internet. Sunday school enrollment saw a 50% decrease over 2019. The Sunday school classes would normally provide special music throughout the year but were not able to this year. Again, we look forward to the day when those voices can sing out to the Lord in unison once again.

Your church leadership wishes to continue emphasizing these same areas along with **Evangelism** and **Gracious Stewardship** in 2021.

#### **Budget Total - \$132,306.20**

(This includes a percentage of the Pastor's salary; parsonage utilities, expenses, and insurance; the Parish Administrator, Choir Director, organist, and custodians' salaries; janitorial supplies; telephone; copier; insurance, maintenance, and utilities.)

#### B) We love our neighbors as ourselves:

In 2020 OELC was not able to continue its sponsorship of the free monthly community meal in conjunction with the Ignite service on Wednesday nights. However, the Social Concerns Committee, created in 2016, continued on a limited basis to assist with Ruby's Pantry each month, and our congregation is responsible for overseeing and running of the Tri-County Food Pantry on a monthly basis. While our Visiting Partner Ministry, an outreach to OELC members unable to attend regular services was not able to be active, our Prayer Shawl Ministry did provide shawls to individuals in times of comfort and celebration.

The last Sunday of each month provides an opportunity for children and families to bring loose change for the Noisy Offering that goes to OELC ministry/mission areas as well as local area needs. In 2020 this was on a limited basis with the proceeds going to the back pack program. Our high school and middle school programs were limited in 2020. However, some OELC members participated in **Sleep in Heavenly Peace** through construction of beds for families in need.

It is our plan to continue emphasizing these same areas in 2021, along with those programs that were restricted due to the corona virus along with the previously mentioned area of **Evangelism** and **Stewardship**.

#### C) We minister to the needs of ALL people


In 2020 OELC continued its commitment to Osseo and the surrounding area with involvement in, or the sponsoring of, Tri-County Food Pantry and Ruby's Pantry. Through the generosity of OELC members, we contributed to the Sunday school's sponsorship of **God's Global Barnyard** on a limited basis in 2020, providing needed funds for livestock to ELCA sponsored countries. The previously identified Noisy Offering also contributed to Osseo-Fairchild School District's weekend backpack meals program.

Once again, the gifted hands of OELC quilters led to quilts being given to Lutheran World Relief, Trempealeau County Health Care Center, homeless families, fire victims, and OELC members in Assisted Living/Nursing care facilities in the Osseo and surrounding area. We continued our support to the Ministerial Alliance, but the following programs were only able to be conducted on a limited basis early in the year: worship services at Dove Health Care and Pigeon Falls Health Care Center, Chaplin services for Northern Trempealeau County, school supplies to local area schools and hospital visits to Mayo Health Care/Osseo on an as needed basis to serve the whole community when called upon.

The year 2021 will continue these ministries and address the increased need to once again grow our partnership with our Malawi sister congregation and the Northwest Synod Mission areas.

In the early verses of Ephesians 4, the apostle Paul writes to the Christians in Ephesus, a city on the Aegean Sea at the mouth of a river and at the intersection of three trading routes. The letter was written about ten years after the church had started. During the early years of this congregation, Jews and Gentiles from several ethnicities and nationalities had come together to form "one body." Paul was aware that they had done well and commended them for their faith and love.

The word "one" appears more than seven times in the first four verses. This reflects the importance Paul gave to being called into the "unity of Christ." He wanted to note that, although many of the church members came from far off, there is "one Lord, one faith, one baptism." This oneness reflects God's gift of reconciliation in Christ.

A second emphasis from Paul was that, as believers, they were to "bear with one another in love." This would require humility, gentleness and patience as each of them practiced their faith. It would require tolerance to "maintain unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace."

A third emphasis was that each person had been given gifts by God and that these gifts were given to increase the whole. Because the Ephesian church was a young congregation and its members were just beginning in their faith journey, their understandings were often tossed to and fro. But as they grew in faith, each person contributed to building up the body of Christ.

The fourth and final emphasis was that by "speaking the truth in love," each person must grow into Christ. This means taking time to learn about one another and their gifts. Knowing these gifts, we can do God's work both within and beyond the faith community. When there are decisions to make or relationships to reconcile, we know to begin with prayer and reflection, always desiring to speak the truth in love — not for our own benefit but for God's glory, that we might become more complete.

As our members and friends gather today, whether face-to-face or online, we are reminded of our calling into "unity in Christ." We come from many places and work in many contexts, and yet we recognize "one Lord, one faith, one baptism."

Whether new to a worshiping community or further along the journey, we realize that humility, gentleness and patience are required both in the good times and especially in times of uncertainty and struggle. God wants us to be more complete through our work. Christ provides the way. The Holy Spirit is with us for guidance and courage. Each of us has been given the gifts to be complete, and through our faithfulness we will grow stronger and work together as one body.

LET US PRAY: LORD, LET THE WORDS OF THE APOSTLE PAUL DWELL IN US DEEPLY. MAY WE EMBRACE THE RECONCILING POWER OF ONENESS WITH CHRIST. MAY THIS ONENESS GUIDE OUR CONGREGATION AS WE LIVE INTO THE NEW REALITIES OF THESE TIMES. AS WE MEET NEW PARTNERS IN MINISTRY, MAY WE TAKE TIME TO GET TO KNOW THEM WITH PATIENCE, HUMILITY AND LOVE. HELP US TO SEE HOW SHARING OUR GIFTS WILL MAKE YOUR WORK EASIER AND MORE FULFILLING WHILE BRINGING ALL OF US CLOSER TO CHRIST.
