Live Stream Statistics

We live stream our worship services with Boxcast. Before we used this service, livestreaming was very cumbersome. Based on research, this service is the easiest on the market. Before Boxcast, we used YouTube, but then had to use our own encoder, laptop, online software program, and figure out how to make that all work together. Again, with Boxcast, all we need to do is schedule a broadcast (anytime, anywhere), plug it in, turn on the camera and let it do its thing.

Annual Report and Thank You! From Bishop Laurie Skow-Anderson January 2023

Dear Pastors, Deacons, SAMs, lay leaders, members and friends of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin,

Happy New Year! Did you make a New Year's resolution? I wonder what would happen if entire congregations or even if the whole church council would make a New Year's resolution together. What would it be? What might be a God pleasing, faithful New Year's resolution for you, personally? Your church? Your church council?

What is your congregation's New Year's Resolution?

Maybe the New Year's resolution might be to begin every church meeting in the next year by asking a God question like, "I wonder, what does God want us to accomplish in this meeting today? How might what we do in our meeting today please God and be faithful

to our baptismal promises?" As someone once famously said, "The main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing. The main thing is Jesus." What if our New Year resolution is to repeat that phrase before every meeting?

As a synod, we are good at New Year's resolutions, or at least we always have resolutions at our synod assembly! This year our synod resolution will be to learn more about our indigenous neighbors. Jesus said that the main thing, the greatest commandment was to love God and love our neighbors. At the synod assembly on April 29 our theme is *Rebound: From Worry to Wonder*, there will be resolution that will come before the assembly encouraging every congregation to learn about their indigenous neighbors and write their own land acknowledgement and include it on their website and welcome statements in their bulletins. What if your congregation's New Year's Resolution was to learn more about your neighbors and discover new ways to love them?

Our synod's New Year's resolution is to love our neighbors by learning more about our indigenous neighbors and encouraging congregations to write and use land acknowledgements.

What is a land acknowledgement?

It is formal statement that a public event is taking place on land

originally inhabited by <u>indigenous peoples</u>. (Wikipedia) This statement recognizes and respects Indigenous peoples as the traditional stewards of the land and the relationship that exists between them and their traditional territories. Associate Pastor's Report

2022 was a busy year at OELC as the pandemic began to wane and we were able to gather more like normal again. Besides sharing weekly preaching and worship leadership with Pastor Terry, my main focus for the year has been interaction with our youth. We've had monthly senior high events such as movie nights and a game night at Boards & Bricks, and over the summer we gathered around the fire pit for s'mores and fellowship. There's also been an effort to rejuvenate To Gather In Faith (TGIF), the ministry to middle school youth. That group had fun carving pumpkins in October, and future events are planned.

I continue to go where our kids are by attending many extra-curricular events, and this past summer I was an umpire for the community youth softball and baseball leagues for which some of our younger kids played. In order to improve communication, I've set up text groups for all the middle school and senior high parents. I still e-mail youth, mainly using their school e-mail account, and have e-mail contact with at least one parent/guardian for most of the youth.

It was exciting to see nine youth and four adult leaders head for Kentucky as the Appalachia Service Project mission trip was possible again. Of the 13 people that went, six of them were not OELC members, so it was a great community opportunity. The 2023 trip is set for June 23 through July 2, and spots are still available for both youth and adults.

I greatly enjoyed teaching last year's seventh-grade confirmation class. They're now in eighth grade and being taught by Pastor Terry, while a new class of eight fun-loving seventh graders began in September and are learning about Luther's Catechism.

Outreach was another big part of 2022. The senior high youth helped put together Valentine's Day bags that were then delivered to 19 homebound and limited mobility OELC members. Pastor Terry and I are collaborating to visit our homebound/nursing home folks and to reach out to people we haven't heard from for a while to see if OELC is still their church home. We've rotated with other clergy to provide Sunday afternoon worship services at Dove Healthcare along with an All-Saints Day service.

Dave Hoadley, Associate Pastor

We were involved in three community worship services with local churches, and the council approved purchasing a paving brick for the Veteran's Memorial being installed at Stoddard Park. In 2023 we hope to support the proposed playground renovation. OELC adopted a two-mile stretch of Highway 53 south of Osseo and did a clean-up day in October. My wife Cathy and I joined the Osseo Lions Club this fall and were part of the crew that prepared and served the Thanksgiving Day dinner in Fellowship Hall. Prior to that I was asked to give a short prayer at the first annual Turkey Trot that brought over 250 registrations. I regularly join area ELCA clergy colleagues for a Zoom text study on the week's scripture texts, and I visited some of those churches as part of the Lent round-robin in the spring. For Christmas 2021 Cathy organized sponsoring a Trempealeau County family through New Horizons shelter in La Crosse, and the congregation responded with a huge pile of gifts for the parents and children. Another family was sponsored in 2022 and all the gift requests disappeared the first Sunday.

As far as special services go, I officiated at four funerals in 2022 and Pastor Terry and I baptized quite a number of new sisters and brothers into God's family and the OELC community.

Thanks to all of you who partner with us in ministry here, and I pray 2023 will offer many blessings and the chance to serve God and our neighbors in new and exciting ways.

Our newest project will be making twin size quilts for the Sleep in Heavenly Peace mission. Hundreds of children in Trempealeau County have been blessed with their FIRST BED ever, along with new sheets, pillowcases, and new pillows in addition to the warm quilt.

We continue to welcome anyone to join us the 2nd & 4th Tuesday of the month, from 10-4.

This is one of the many prayers that our group of ladies in our Prayer Shawl Ministry pray as we gather monthly. Our group of 9 individuals bring a love of their craft to this ministry and we as a congregation are blessed to have them in our midst. As we adjusted to a new normal in 2022, our monthly gatherings took to the outdoors during the summer months, when possible, to meet at the Osseo Nickel who graciously accommodated our gatherings. We offer our thanks to Kurt Nelson and his family for this outdoor gathering space for us to meet.

While we were still under pandemic protocols in the first few months of this year we were limited with our visits and the ability to always physically be present to wrap our recipients in their shawls, but we again are grateful for Pastor Terry and Pastor Dave, who represented our ministry to fulfill this service on our behalf. We resumed our in-service presentation of Baptismal shawls in the Spring which was welcomed by many of our church family.

During 2022, 22 adult shawls and 19 Baptismal shawls were presented to individuals recovering from illness or accidents as well as those joyful moments of Baptism.

Since our ministry began in 2011, the cost of yarn has increased significantly along with changes in the types of yarn that we prefer to use for Prayer Shawls. Our ministry is solely funded by generous monetary donations through memorials, THRIVENT CHOICE dollars and general giving from the heart. As always, we are frugal with our yarn purchases and are always watching for sales and using discounts whenever possible to make the best use of your kind and thoughtful monetary contributions. Tri County Food Pantry... Thanks You!

The Tri County Food Pantry has been serving area residents in Eau Claire, Trempealeau and Jackson Counties since 1994.

Thank you to the many individuals, area churches, groups and clubs for their generosity. Without these donations 294 households, 719 individuals could not have been helped with food insecurity during this past year. It is safer and easier to purchase food from Feed My People, as each dollar and can purchase \$4 of food. Therefore, cash donations go further than food donations and we can purchase what is needed.... AND food can be delivered.

Each year seems to have a different challenge. Times are changing as last December we served 23 households with a total of 55 people. This past month, November, we served 43 households with a total of 103 people. Another change is the increase in the number of senior citizens appreciating a little help. Each person gets a cart and shops for themselves so families can take what they need.

The food pantry is open once a month. The third Saturday from 10 to 11 or until all have been served. There is a small food cupboard by the south entrance outside the church office. This is available to anyone, anytime the church is open. Please don't hesitate to use this resource.

To make all this possible, we depend on a dedicated core of friendly and caring people to help serve guests. We always need of new volunteers. The only requirement is a cheerful, giving heart. Help is also needed when deliveries are received the second and fourth Thursday of each month, food rescue once a week, and a couple of pickups in Eau Claire a month. This is heavy and time sensitive work.

We also want to make a public thank you to Ruby's Pantry for letting us have first dibs on food left over after their monthly distribution. This food is also shared with the Mondovi food pantry. We are extremely thankful for the volunteers at Ruby's who help pick up and stock the food in our pantry.

Endowment Fund Committee Report

In 2022, the Endowment Fund Committee began by welcoming newly elected three-year term members Maria Paulus and Sharon Steinke.

The next order of business was to determine the amount of funds available for distribution, following the guidelines outlined in the fund's resolution. Based on the fund's performance in 2021, the committee recommended 6% and was approved for distribution of \$76,311.68. It was determined that past year's unused allotments of \$80,830 could be used also, making the total for 2022, \$157,141.68.

The committee once again reached out to OELC high school seniors who wished to apply for college scholarships in 2022. Five OELC youth were awarded scholarships based on their academic achievements, extracurricular activities, and contributions to OELC. The funds also paid for the blacktop for both parking lots, lighting in the sanctuary, air conditioning for the parsonage, a stone for Veterans Park, and the assessment of the city's streets.

The church has 5 funds that are either restricted or unrestricted, some temporarily restricted and some permanently. The "General Fund Checking" makes up these 5 funds, instead of having 5 different checking/savings accounts. This is called fund accounting and many non-profits use this method.

If you look below at the total money on January 1, 2022 ~ \$151,032.66 ~ that comprises the general operating fund, special gifts fund, mission fund, debt fund & youth fund. The headings below give the page number for the respective fund.

The bottom row of the chart gives the balances we started 2023 with.

The Endowment Fund is separate from the general fund and has its own checking & savings accounts as you can see on the previous pages.

During this meeting, there will be a presentation on where the church stands on being able to pay its bills this year. In 2022, the church had a deficit of \$76,704, but we luckily had the proceeds from the sale of the parsonage and the payroll protection program to be able to stay in the black.

Currently, we have 922 members of OELC. Of these 922 members, we have ~186 "giving units." A giving unit is a group of members (i.e., households/families) who contribute jointly to the church." To be able to pay the bills starting in March, we need all of the 186 to increase their giving by \$35/month.

If you want to help the church succeed in 2023 & don't give regularly, see Molly Vold for the many options OELC has for scheduling weekly or monthly giving today. Although it says \$35/month, anything you are able to budget, even \$5/month, will help.
