WE'RE OFF TO THE BWCA ONCE AGAIN



This coming Summer of 2022 7 young members of OELC and the surrounding area who have completed 8th through 12th Grade will have a chance to take part in a canoe trip into the BWCA (Boundary Waters Canoe Area). This year about 23,000 fewer entry permits are being issued but I was lucky enough to get one for our group of 9. Our group will consist of 7 youth along with Bill Prudlick and myself.

We will leave Osseo bright and early on Wednesday, June 29th and return on Sunday, July 3rd in the afternoon. Our permit allows us to access the BWCA at entry point #52 near Brandt Lake which is about 1 hour north of Grand Marais, MN.

By the time this article is published we will have had our first informational meeting at church and encouraged any interested youth to sign up. Hopefully, as you are reading this and find yourself interested, there are still some spots available. It is important to call me as soon as you suspect you might like to go as spots are awarded first come, first serve.

The BWCA area is best described as unique, pristine, & peaceful and at the same time can be very hard work, occasionally uncomfortable, and a place where sometimes the fish just don't' bite. It is also a place where the beauty of God's creation shines forth with gorgeous sunsets, intimate viewing of wildlife, and a measured amount of solitude.

We have access to trailer, canoes, paddles, tents, packs, cook kits, etc. Participants need only bring their own personal items including fishing gear and a life jacket. Please give me a call or stop to see me at church if you have any questions.

Also, please know that our church is a part of a ministerium which is funded by area churches for the purpose of helping folks in need. We don't make calls to individual members of the church asking on behalf of others.

Thanks For The Sermon Prep Help!

I was pleasantly surprised by the number of folks who offered commentary, questions, and reflections on last month's invitation to help with the February 13th sermon. For those who found this little experiment helpful in preparing for worship (count me in) here is an opportunity to do it again. On Sunday, March 13th I will be preaching on the gospel reading from Luke, chapter 13, verses 31-35. This time I'll let you look it up in your own translation or as someone last month advised, looking it up in two or more different translations can be very helpful in your pondering. I'll warn you now, this time around Jesus gives us a hearty helping of ambiguous statements to ponder.



For many years B.C. (Before COVID), it was a tradition that regional churches participated in what has come to be known as a round-robin. Each Wednesday evening during Lent, ministers would travel to other churches to preach and lead worship. In 2020 the Lent season had just begun when COVID shut everything down, and in 2021 churches provided their own worship experiences as they could.

The pastors of the Dairyland Conference decided to revive the round-robin for 2022. I will be out representing OELC at five area parishes and we will have five guest ministers coming here. The group chose to follow a set of themes from the Augsburg Fortress worship resource *Sundays and Seasons*. The schedule for OELC is:

March 9: Julie Garber, Osseo United Church of Christ—"Mercy"

March 16: Luke Pederson, Trinity and Good Shepherd Lutheran near Mondovi—"<u>Compassion</u>"

March 23: Peter Jonas, Grace Lutheran in Pleasantville and Our Savior's in Whitehall—"<u>Forgiveness</u>"

March 30: Dave Christianson, Upper Pigeon Creek of Hixton and Kings Valley & South Beef River of Osseo—"<u>Love</u>"

April 6: Paul Tobiason, Chimney Rock Lutheran, Strum—"<u>Faithfulness</u>"

The service includes prayers and hymns, gospel texts from Luke and John, and readings of poetry from authors of the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries. Some time for silent reflection is also incorporated as we journey together towards the somberness of Holy Week and the celebration of Easter Sunday.

Each Lenten Wednesday evening will start with a soup supper at 5:00 pm with worship beginning at 6:00 pm in the sanctuary. I hope you will plan to attend!

Holistic stewardship for Lent

For centuries Lutherans have observed Lent with passionate devotion and prayerful attention to spiritual disciplines. These faith practices strengthen our souls and open our hearts to the resurrected Christ at Easter.

This year, try developing a sense of holistic stewardship for your life. Stewardship, of course, looks at how we use not just our financial abundance but <u>all</u> the blessings that God has given us – our health, our family and friends, our faith, our time, our intelligence, and so on.

Just as holistic medicine takes a "big picture" view of physical health as a dynamic interconnection of our body's systems, holistic stewardship helps us see and appreciate all our gifts in relationship to one another.

For instance, how does your stewardship of time interact with your stewardship of your relationships or health? How might more-thoughtful stewardship of your time improve your relationships or your health? How might better stewardship of time, relationships and health improve your financial abundance?

When you examine your stewardship of these and all your gifts in dynamic interconnection with one another, you can find more meaning and purpose as a disciple of Jesus.

To get there, for the days of Lent focus on just five major categories of the blessings God has given you easily remembered by the shorthand word FAITH.

Family and friends – nurturing relationships. Abundance -- finance and material possessions. Intelligence – your mind and special talents. Time -- living fully 24/7. Health – physical and emotional wellness.

Spend 15 minutes every day to prayerfully ponder and meditate on these FAITH blessings. A prayer journal or notebook may help you process and connect.

- Take stock of your blessings in each category, thanking God for them.
- Reflect on how they interrelate to give you joy and purpose and meaning.
- Ask God to help you use these gifts more wisely and fully for God's purposes.
- Imagine God blessing and enriching your life as you learn to steward these gifts in a way that they will support and enhance one another.

This Lent, let holistic stewardship help you envision your gifts and life more fully in God's reality, the reality called the Reign of God. It's the Reign that Jesus preached and proclaimed, and that he brought to fulfillment with the victory over death that we celebrate at Easter.
